**DIRECTIONS FOR USE** 

## **Heavily Soiled Concrete Floors:**

- 1. Wet area to be cleaned.
- 2. Spread powder at a use-rate of 1 to 3 pounds per 100 square feet of concrete.
- 3. Scrub soiled areas with a brush/broom. Let solution stand for 15 to 30 minutes.
- 4. Agitate floor a second time to loosen stubborn grease and soils.
- 5. Rinse freely and air dry.

## **Lightly Soiled Concrete Floors:**

- 1. Add 2 ounces to 1 pound of product to a pail of hot water.
- 2. Apply solution to floor and agitate with a broom. Let solution stand for 5 minutes.
- 3. Rinse freely and air dry.
